The Montreal Cognitive Assessment. The Montreal Cognitive Assessment (MoCA) (Nasreddine, et al.,) is a brief (minute) cognitive screening instrument that was developed on a geriatric population to

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be sensitive to mild cognitive impairment (MCI). Though not a clearly-defined syndrome, MCI is regarded as cognitive dysfunction in excess of normal age-related decline that does not .

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The Mini-Mental State Examination (MMSE) The MMSE is a quick 5-10 minute screening that looks for cognitive impairment and possible dementia. The domains it assesses include orientation, registration, attention, calculation, and language and praxis. The scores range from no cognitive impairment to severe cognitive impairment.

Engage patient in distractor activity for 2 to 3 minutes, such as counting to 20 and back, counting back from 100 by 7, spelling WORLD backwards. 5. FREE RECALL — 2 points per word: Ask patient to state as many of the 4 words he or she can recall. Allow at least 5 seconds per item for free recall.

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a patient for cognitive impairment. While screening results alone are insufficient to diagnose dementia, they are an important first step. The AD8 (PDF, 1.2M) and Mini-Cog (PDF, 86K) are among many possible tools.

Clinical cognitive assessment in those with suspected dementia should include examination of attention and concentration, orientation, short-term and long-term memory, praxis, language and executive function. As part of this assessment, formal cognitive testing should be undertaken using a standardised instrument.

Furthermore, although cognitive screening instruments are affected by age and education, clinicians are generally unaware of this. For the SMMSE, a person who is illiterate, may not be able to spell world backwards, read 'close your eyes' or write a sentence. This person automatically loses seven points before he/she starts.

Cognitive screening instruments are cheap, fast, and non-invasive tools to identify adults at risk to have symptomatic AD. At present, the most used cognitive screening instrument for the detection of AD is the Mini-Mental State Examination (MMSE [5]).
